







Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

- Romans 6:3-4

Christianity clearly affirms that in the long struggle between good and evil, good eventually will emerge as victor. Evil is ultimately doomed by the powerful, inexorable forces of good. Good Friday must give way to the triumphant music of Easter.

There's a tendency in religion to spiritualize the central claims – to disconnect our faith from the realities of daily life. But if going to church is just about getting to heaven, then Christianity doesn't have much to say to us about this side of eternity. Lutherans are especially at risk of becoming complacent when we cheapen the gift of grace to the point that we let it wash over us without changing us. *Yes, yes, Jesus died and rose again so that we might have abundant life*, we hear again and again, but we go about our business as though the story of God's redemption does not implicate us in a life-changing way.

Holy Week commemorates the heart of that story, bearing witness to the shocking proposal that God-with-us endures the worst possible death at our hands, yet overcomes it for our sake. The risen Lord meets the women on the path from the tomb and says, "Greetings! Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me" (Matthew 28:9-10). Emerging from his tomb, Jesus promises to convene his followers yet again, to organize us in the work of resurrection. "Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father," the Apostle Paul puts it, "so we too might walk in newness of life."

So, resurrection is not simply the promise of bodily regeneration after death. It's not just a pie-in-the-sky hope relegated to the future. Easter proclaims that Jesus' movement from death to life is the key to understanding God's purpose amid the deathly circumstances of human life today. Resurrection begins now!

The question remains: *Will we emerge from our tomb?* The stone is rolled away, but will we step out into the light of Easter morning and follow the risen Jesus where he leads?

Walking in newness of life is risky. It involves confronting death wherever it is manifested in the world. It means acknowledging the crosses of others without looking away. It means defying the structures of evil that crucify marginalized people in the first place.

But, it also means trusting that death will not have the final word. "Good Friday must give way to the triumphant music of Easter." And, no longer bound by death, the Lord of life leaves us with a trustworthy word to sustain us in the meantime: "Do not be afraid.... And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).





SCAVENGER EGG HUNT: Ages 7 to 12


