"For most of us, every Sunday is more like the Sunday after Easter. We can hear the accounts, but we were not really there. We did not see and touch and experience for ourselves."

Late for Easter

Thomas was late for Easter. Can you imagine his confusion and disappointment? Everyone else was buzzing about Jesus' visit that first Sunday evening, but Thomas had missed it. So, he couldn't bring himself to celebrate with them. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands... I will not believe."

Maybe you can relate. After all, we're late for Easter, too. None of us has had the privilege of an encounter with the risen Christ. Our faith is founded instead on the good news as reported to us by others – parents, grandparents, and baptismal sponsors; pastors, youth directors, and teachers; celebrated saints and martyrs – all those who have repeated the sacred story, planting the seed of faith in each new generation. But, wouldn't you like to see for your-self? Wouldn't you like some hard evidence?

The witness to the resurrection throughout the centuries is itself a miracle, although we are just as reluctant to accept it as Thomas. Nevertheless, here we are, reading a newsletter article or blog or devotional book, showing up to Sunday worship, participating in a Bible study, reading the story to our children or grandchildren, or offering silent, sometimes wordless prayers of gratitude or need. Something calls us back to this impossible truth, that God has somehow seen Jesus through pain and death, and will see us through, too.

Your doubt is not weak or shameful. Doubt and faith are two sides of the same coin. But this Easter season, look for signs of resurrection to sustain you, little graces to keep you coming back. Listen for words that strike your heart, moments that speak to the hope of new life.

And remember: you are blessed, because unlike the first disciples, you have *not* seen for yourself, yet you continue to strive (John 20:29).



## COUNCIL BLURBS FOR APRIL

The council met on April 11, 2017 opening with devotions and prayer.


Action items for the council included:

- Accepting a recommendation from the Bequest Planning Team to distribute funds from the Bjornstad-Hoogakker-Frederickson memorial funds. It was approved to grant \$90,000 to each of the following: Endowment, Property and Outreach.
- Accepting a recommendation from the Finance committee to use the annual return on the Mission Investment Fund to pay down our mortgage.
- Accepting a recommendation from Property to upgrade the lighting in the church buildings (except the sanctuary). This is part of a Puget Sound energy audit, with approximately 70% of this cost covered by a Small Business Grant with Peace paying \$2252.50 of the approximately \$8000.00 bill. The energy savings will be approximately \$1250.00 per year so the savings in energy will be immediate.
- Council also approved \$300.00 for use by Pastor Nate to attend a synod mentoring group to improve spiritual vitality. Half of the fee will be a gift from the church council
- The council also entertained a proposal for use of our gathering space but it was tabled until the issues of legality and tax status can be addressed with the synod due to our non-profit, non-secular status.

The council will meet again May 9.



## Summary of 2016 Amendments to the Model Constitution of the ELCA

The 2016 Churchwide Assembly authorized the secretary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to:

- strike the words "ordained minister/s" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Sacrament";
- strike the word "clergy" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Sacrament";
- strike the words "pastor/s" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Sacrament" where appropriate;
- strike the words "associate in ministry, diaconal minister and deaconess" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Service"; and
- make editorial corrections that identify the rosters of this church and implement the creation of the ministers of Word and Service roster.

## The amendments also:

- acknowledge that the ELCA "participates in The **Lutheran World Federation** as a global communion of churches, engaging in faithful witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ and in service for the sake of God's mission in the world."
- acknowledge (in addition to "Voting" and "Associate" members) "Seasonal" members as "voting members of other ELCA congregations who wish to retain such membership but de sire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation, including exercising limited voting rights in this congregation." (see C8.02.e.)
- establish expectations for the call and ministry of minister/s of Word and Service (see C9.21-31)
- establish policy for two or more congregations that intend to unite to form a **parish** (or multiple-location congregation) (see C20.1-6)

## AMENDMENTS TO THE *MODEL CONSTITUTION FOR CONGREGATIONS* AS APPROVED BY THE **2016** CHURCHWIDE ASSEMBLY

Prepared by the Office of the Secretary Evangelical Lutheran Church in America April 20, 2017

### Additions are underlined. Deletions are struck through in the text.

In coordination with the following amendments, the 2016 Churchwide Assembly authorized the secretary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to:

- \$ strike the words "ordained minister/s" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Sacrament";
- \$ strike the word "clergy" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Sacrament";
- \$ strike the words "pastor/s" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Sacrament" where appropriate;
- \$ strike the words "associate in ministry, diaconal minister and deaconess" and replace with the words "minister/s of Word and Service"; and
- \$ make editorial corrections that identify the rosters of this church and implement the creation of the ministers of Word and Service roster.
- \*C3.02. This church confesses the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church and is resolved to serve Christian Unity throughout the world.
- \*C3.03. The Church exists both as an inclusive fellowship and as local congregations gathered for worship and Christian service. Congregations find their fulfillment in the universal community of the Church, and the universal Church exists in and through congregations. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, therefore, derives its character and powers both from the sanction and representation of its congregations and from its inherent nature as an expression of the broader fellowship of the faithful. In length, it acknowledges itself to be in the historic continuity of the communion of saints; in breadth, it expresses the fellowship of believers and congregations in our day.
- \*C3.04. This church, inspired and led by the Holy Spirit, participates in The Lutheran World Federation as a global communion of churches, engaging in faithful witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ and in service for the sake of God's mission in the world.
- \*C3.0305. The name Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA or "this church") as used herein refers in general references to this whole church, including its three expressions: congregations, synods, and the churchwide organization. The name Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is also the name of the corporation of the churchwide organization to which specific references may be made herein.
- **\*C5.03.** Only such authority as is delegated to the Congregation Council or other organizational units in this congregation's governing documents is recognized. All remaining authority is retained by the congregation. The congregation is authorized to:

c. call a minister of Word and Service;

. . .

- <u>d.</u> or terminate the call of associates in ministry, deaconesses, and diaconal ministers a minister of <u>Word and Service</u> in conformity with the applicable policy <u>constitution</u> of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America;
- de. adopt amendments to the constitution, as provided in Chapter-<u>17\_16</u>, amendments to the bylaws, as specified in Chapter-<u>16\_17</u>, and continuing resolutions, as provided in Chapter 18;
- ef. approve the annual budget;
- fg. acquire real and personal property by gift, devise, purchase, or other lawful means;
- gh. hold title to and use its property for any and all activities consistent with its purpose;
- hi. sell, mortgage, lease, transfer, or otherwise dispose of its property by any lawful means;

- ij. elect its [officers][,] [and] Congregation Council, [boards, and committees,] and require [them] [the members of the council] to carry out their duties in accordance with the constitution[,] [and] bylaws[,] [and continuing resolutions]; and
- jk. terminate its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as provided in Chapter 6.
- \*C6.03.

. . .

. . .

This congregation acknowledges its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in which:

- c. This congregation agrees to call pastoral leadership from the <u>clergy-roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament</u> of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in accordance with its call procedures except in special circumstances and with the approval of the bishop of the synod. These special circumstances are limited either to calling a candidate approved for the roster of ordained ministers <u>Ministers of Word and Sacrament</u> of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or to contracting for pastoral services with an <u>ordained</u> minister <u>of Word and Sacrament</u> of a church body with which the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America officially has established a relationship of full communion.
- d. This congregation agrees to consider <del>associates in ministry, deaconesses, and diaconal</del> ministers <u>of Word and Service</u> for call to other staff positions in the congregation according to the procedures of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- \*C6.05. A-<u>This</u> congregation may terminate its relationship with this church the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America by the following procedure:
  - f. Notice of termination shall be forwarded by the bishop to the secretary of this church the ELCA, who shall report the termination to the Churchwide Assembly.
  - g. This congregation shall abide by these covenants by and among the three expressions of this church:
    - <u>1</u> Congregations seeking to terminate their relationship with this church which fail or refuse to comply with each of the foregoing provisions in \*C6.05. shall be required to receive Synod Council approval before terminating their membership in this church.
  - h. 2) Congregations which had been members of the Lutheran Church in America shall be required, in addition to complying with the foregoing provisions in \*C6.05., to receive synodical approval before terminating their membership in this church.
  - i- 3) Congregations established by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America shall be required, in addition to complying with the foregoing provisions in \*C6.05., to satisfy all financial obligations to this church and receive Synod Council approval before terminating their membership in this church.
  - jh. If a-this congregation fails to achieve the required two-thirds vote of voting members present at the congregation's first meeting as specified in paragraph a. above, another special meeting to consider termination of relationship with this church may be called no sooner than six months after that first meeting. If a-this congregation fails to achieve the required two-thirds vote of voting members present at the congregation's second meeting as specified in paragraph d. above, another attempt to consider termination of relationship with this church meeting as specified in paragraph d. above, another attempt to consider termination of relationship with this church must follow all requirements of \*C6.05. and may begin no sooner than six months after that second meeting.
- \*C7.03. If a-two-thirds majority-of the voting members of this congregation present at a legally called and conducted special meeting of this congregation vote to transfer to another Lutheran church body, title to property shall continue to reside in this congregation, provided the process for termination of relationship in \*C6.05. has been followed. Before this congregation takes action to transfer to another Lutheran church body, it shall consult with representatives of the <u>(insert name of synod)</u> Synod.

- \*C7.04. If a-two-thirds majority-of the voting members of this congregation present at a legally called and conducted special meeting of this congregation vote to become independent or relate to a non-Lutheran church body and have followed the process for termination of relationship in \*C6.05., title to property of this congregation shall continue to reside in this congregation only with the consent of the Synod Council. The Synod Council, after consultation with this congregation by the established synodical process, may give approval to the request to become independent or to relate to a non-Lutheran church body, in which case title shall remain with the majority of this congregation. If the Synod Council fails to give such approval, title shall remain with those members who desire to continue as a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- \*C8.02. Members shall be classified as follows:
  - c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of the congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
  - d. Associate members are persons holding membership in other [ELCA] [Lutheran] [Christian] congregations who wish to retain such membership but desire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation, or persons who wish to retain a relationship with this congregation while being members of other congregations. They These individuals have all the privileges and duties of membership except voting rights and eligibility for elected offices or membership on the Congregation Council of this congregation or other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
  - e. Seasonal members are voting members of other ELCA congregations who wish to retain such membership but desire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation, including exercising limited voting rights in this congregation. The Congregation Council may grant seasonal membership to such persons provided that this congregation is a member of a synod where the Synod Council has approved seasonal member voting on its territory. Such seasonal members shall have all the privileges and duties of voting members except that:
    - they shall not be eligible for elected office in, or for membership on the Congregation Council or on a call committee of, this congregation;
    - 2) they shall not have the right to vote on any matter concerning or affecting the call or termination of call of any minister of this congregation;
  - 3) they shall not have the right to vote on any matter concerning or affecting the affiliation of this congregation with the ELCA;
  - <u>4) they shall not be eligible to serve as voting members from this congregation of the Synod</u> Assembly or the Churchwide Assembly;
  - 5) they shall not, even if otherwise permitted by this congregation, vote by proxy or by absentee ballot; and
  - 6) they shall not, within any two calendar month period, exercise voting rights in this congregation and in the congregation where they remain voting members.

\*C8.05.

- Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following:
  - a. death;
  - b. resignation;
  - c. transfer or release;
  - d. disciplinary action in accordance with ELCA constitutional provision 20.4041. and the accompanying bylaws; or
  - removal from the roll due to inactivity as defined in the bylaws in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.

Such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the Church has a continuing pastoral concern.

#### Chapter 9.

### THE PASTOR ROSTERED MINISTER

. . .

- \*C9.01. Authority to call a pastor shall be in this congregation by at least a two-thirds majority ballot-vote of voting members present and voting at a meeting legally called for that purpose. Before a call is issued, the officers, or a committee elected by [this congregation][the Congregation Council] to recommend the call, shall seek the advice and help of the bishop of the synod.
- \*C9.02. Only a member of the clergy-roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or a candidate for the roster of ordained ministers Ministers of Word and Sacrament who has been recommended for the congregation by the synodical bishop may be called as a pastor of this congregation.
- **\*C9.03.** Consistent with the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America,
  - a. Every ordained minister of Word and Sacrament shall:
    - provide pastoral care;
    - 5) seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel;
    - <u>6) impart knowledge of this church and its wider ministry though distribution of its communications and publications;</u>
    - 7) witness to the Kingdom of God in the community, in the nation, and abroad; and
    - 58) speak publicly to the world in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, calling for justice and proclaiming God's love for the world.
    - b. Each ordained minister pastor with a congregational call shall, within the congregation:
      - 2) supervise relate to all schools and organizations of this congregation;
      - 3) install regularly elected members of the Congregation Council; and
      - with the council, administer discipline.
  - c. Every pastor shall:

. . .

- -1) -strive to extend the Kingdom of God in the community, in the nation, and abroad;
- 2) seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel;
  - 3) impart knowledge of this church and its wider ministry through distribution of its periodicals and other publications; and
  - 45) endeavor to increase the support given by the congregation to the work of the <u>ELCA</u> churchwide organization of the <u>Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)</u> and of the <u>(insert name of synod)</u> Synod of the ELCA.
- \*C9.05. The provisions for termination of the mutual relationship between a minister of Word and Sacrament and this congregation shall be as follows:
  - a. The call of <u>a this</u> congregation, when accepted by a pastor, shall constitute a continuing mutual relationship and commitment, which shall be terminated only by death or, following consultation with the synodical bishop, for the following reasons:
    - resignation or removal of the pastor from the roster of ordained ministers Ministers of Word and Sacrament of this church;
  - b. When allegations of physical disability or mental incapacity of the pastor under paragraph a.4) above, or ineffective conduct of the pastoral office under paragraph a.3) above, have come to the attention of the bishop of this synod,
    - the bishop in his or her sole discretion may investigate such conditions personally together with a committee of two ordained-rostered ministers and one layperson, or
    - 2) when such allegations have been brought to the synod's attention by an official recital of allegations by the Congregation Council or by a petition signed by at least one-third of the

voting members of the congregation, the bishop personally shall investigate such conditions together with a committee of two ordained-rostered ministers and one layperson.

- c. In case of alleged physical disability or mental incapacity under paragraph a.4) above, the bishop's committee shall obtain and document competent medical opinion concerning the pastor's condition. When a disability or incapacity is evident to the committee, the bishop of this synod may declare the pastorate vacant and the pastor shall be listed on the clergy roster as disabled. When the pastorate is declared vacant, the Synod Council shall list the pastor on the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament as disabled. Upon removal of the disability and the restoration of the pastor to health, the bishop shall take steps to enable the pastor to resume the ministry, either in the congregation last served or in another appropriate call.

If either party fails to assent to the recommendations of the bishop's committee concerning the pastor's call, the congregation may dismiss the pastor only at a legally called meeting after consultation with the bishop, either (a) by a two-thirds majority vote of the voting members present and voting where the bishop and the committee did not recommend termination of the call, or (b) by a simple majority vote of the voting members present and voting where the bishop and the call.

Amendments may be proposed by at least \_\_\_\_\_\_ voting members or by the Congregation Council. Proposals must be filed in writing with the Congregation Council 60 days before formal consideration by this congregation at a regular or special Congregation Meeting called for that purpose. The Congregation Council shall notify the congregation's members of the proposal together with the council's recommendations at least 30 days in advance of the meeting. Notification may take place by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law.

\*C176.03.

An amendment to this constitution, proposed under **\*C176.01**., shall:

- a. be approved at a legally called Congregation Meeting according to this constitution by a majority vote of those <u>voting members</u> present and voting;
- b. be ratified without change at the next annual meeting by a two-thirds majority-vote of those voting members present and voting; and
- c. have the effective date included in the resolution<sup>1</sup> and noted in the constitution.

Any amendments to this constitution that result from the processes provided in \*C176.01. and \*C176.02. shall be sent by the secretary of this congregation to the synod. The synod shall notify the

congregation of its decision to approve or disapprove the proposed changes; the changes shall go into effect upon notification that the synod has approved them.

\*C176.04.

This constitution may be amended to bring any section into conformity with a section or sections, either required or not required, of the *Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America* as most recently amended by the Churchwide Assembly. Such amendments may be approved by a simple-majority vote of those voting members present and voting at any legally called meeting of the congregation without presentation at a prior meeting of the congregation, provided that the Congregation Council has submitted by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law, notice to the congregation of such an amendment or amendments, together with the council's recommendations, at least 30 days prior to the meeting. Upon the request of <u>at least two (2)</u> voting members of the congregation, the Congregation Council shall submit such notice. Following the adoption of an amendment, the secretary of the congregation shall submit a copy thereof to the synod. Such provisions shall become effective immediately following a vote of approval.
