#### What is the Synod Assembly?



Each congregation sends at least two lay voting members along with their rostered ministers. <u>How Many Lay Voting Members Does My Congregation Get?</u> It's based on your 2018 parochial report sent to the ELCA.

Please try to send voting members that are interested in moving the ELCA and your congregation into the future with all of the excitement, changes and challenges that may bring. We'll be thinking outside the box!






