

*From the Pastor's Desk S* Everyone is a Youth Minister

"Speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." -Ephesians 4:15-16

"While [congregations with greater numbers of maturing Christian young people] had some age segregated activity, ministry with youth was central to the whole of congregational life and something that the whole congregation saw as their job—everyone a Youth Minister." -Exemplary Youth Ministry Study, 2003

Historically, the church has segregated itself according to age. Ministries with older adults don't tend to attract younger adults, ministries with younger adults don't tend to engage youth, ministries with youth don't tend to incorporate young children, and ministries with children and youth only involve a small number of courageous adults with a distinct sense of call and series of gifts. We all sit together in Sunday worship, but that is our only shared experience.

Age-specific ministries are valuable as means of strengthening bonds of affinity. There are certain aspects of the life of faith that only a person in one's age bracket will understand. Unfortunately, however, the more we learn about healthy congregations the more we realize that we have privileged age-specific ministries at the expense of the overall vitality of the congregation, and specifically to the detriment of the faith of young people.

The Exemplary Youth Ministry (EYM) Study, completed in 2003, was an unprecedented national study of congregations of all sizes in seven denominations, the goal of which was to identify and analyze congregations with relatively thriving ministries with young people (<u>https://vibrantfaith.org/project/eym/</u>). The key leaders of the study highlight a number of findings, two of which stand out:

• "It is the spirit and the culture of the entire congregation," and not just the leadership directly involved with youth, "that contributes [to] maturity in Christian young people," and


• "Parents [and families] emerged as the primary influence on the religious and social lives of young people. Their faith had a direct impact on the faith of their children."

In light of this wisdom, why would we continue to reinforce the historic divide along the lines of age? Why would we continue to imagine that homogeneous groups, sometimes referred to as "silos," are the most effective means of growing in faith individually and as a community? And, how might we begin to shift the culture of our own congregation?

This fall, we are introducing a new approach to the 9:30 hour on Sunday mornings. Gatherings during that time will be more integrated, joining adults with youth and older children with younger children on a more regular basis. The first Sunday of each month will be intergenerational, joining people of all ages together for fellowship and service. The second Sunday will mix Sunday school students of all ages with their families and other adults for biblical storytelling. The third and fourth Sundays will resemble traditional age-specific Sunday school. And when it occurs on the calendar, the fifth Sunday of the month will feature a congregation-wide potluck and roundtable conversations.

Would you join us? We look forward to growing together in faith, hope, and love, and we need you!





Habitat for Humanity Global Village Trip | Feb-Mar 2020

#### Location

Vietnam, Central region, Quang Nam province. Build location TBD. Dates GV Build week: Feb 29 - Mar 7, 2020



\* Participants are required to arrive in Vietnam no later than Feb 28, 2020.

\* If no extended travel is planned after the build, participants may depart from Vietnam anytime on Mar 8, 2020.

#### Price

\* The trip fee will be \$1,750 per person, plus airfare, This includes room, board and transportation during the build.

\* Air fares from the US west coast to Da Nang airport will range from \$800 - \$1,000 depending on the timing of purchase.

#### Extended travel

\* The team leader, Dang Nguyen, is organizing an optional group bike tour after the build. The bike tour will start from the Da Lat highlands (South region) to the coastal city of Nha Trang and ending up in Hoi An (Central region)

\* Tour cost will be approximately \$1,500 - the final price depends on the total number of people signing up. This tour requires reasonable bike fitness that anyone can train up to between now and March 2020 (in riding lingo, it's really the butt time on the bike).

\* Those who do not wish to bike have the choice of driving along in the support vehicle or signing up with a group tour or simply planning your own travel. (there are many options!)

#### Next Steps

Participants will be asked to follow the timeline of activities below:

\* July 2019: Register online and make a \$350 non-refundable deposit

\* July/August 2019: Sign up for optional bike tour if desired

\* September 2019: All participants will be asked to purchase their airline tickets so the visa process can be initiated.

\* December 2019: Final payment of trip fee will be due

\* February 2020: Obtain visa once the visa information is available




